
Preparation for Worship

A Reading from Prophet Isaiah, the 1st Chapter beginning with the 10th verse

Hear the word of the Lord, you rulers of Sodom! Listen to the teaching of our God, you people of Gomorrah! What to me is the multitude of your sacrifices? says the Lord; I have had enough of burnt offerings of rams and the fat of fed beasts; I do not delight in the blood of bulls, or of lambs, or of goats. When you come to appear before me, who asked this from your hand? Trample my courts no more; bringing offerings is futile; incense is an abomination to me. New moon and sabbath and calling of convocation—I cannot endure solemn assemblies with iniquity. Your new moons and your appointed festivals my soul hates; they have become a burden to me, I am weary of bearing them. Sunday School Begins Sunday

St. Andrew's Sunday school has begun. Children from 7 years old and up will meet at 9:00am in the Sunday School room over the Parish Office. (Ask anyone and they will be happy to direct you.) Each Sunday we will watch a video about something from the Bible and then make a craft to illustrate the story. Adults are welcome to join us if you are curious about what we do.

Also, there will be a class for 3 to 6 year olds after the 10:00 am service. This class meets near the piano in the main room of the Parish House during Coffee Hour. We will learn songs or Bible stories and maybe make a craft. This will be a short session while Parents enjoy Coffee Hour.



YOGA CLASSES
