A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles, the 9th Chapter beginning with the 1st verse

The people sit.

Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He asked, "Who are you, Lord?" The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do." The men who were traveling with him stood speechless because they heard the voice but saw no one. Saul got up from the ground, and though his eyes were open, he could see nothing; so they led him by the hand and brought him into Damascus. For three days he was without sight, and neither ate nor drank.

Now there was a disciple in Damascus named Ananias. The Lord said to him in a

vision, “Ananias.” He answered, “Here I am, Lord.” The Lord said to him, “Get up and go to the street called Straight, and at the house of Judas look for a man of Tarsus named Saul. At this moment he is praying, and he has seen in a vision a man named Ananias come in and lay his hands on him so that he might regain his sight.”

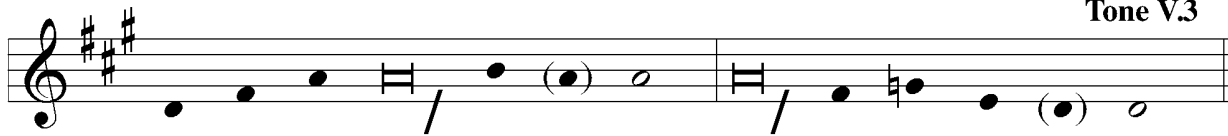
But Ananias answered, “Lord, I have heard from many about this man, how much evil he has done to your saints in Jerusalem; and here he has authority from the chief priests to bind all who invoke your name.” But the Lord said to him, “Go, for he is an instrument whom I have chosen to bring my name before Gentiles and kings and before the people of Israel; I myself will show him how much he must suffer for the sake of my name.” So Ananias went and entered the house. He laid his hands on Saul and said, “Brother Saul, the Lord Jesus, who appeared to you on your way here, has sent me so that you may regain your sight and be filled with the Holy Spirit.” And immediately something like scales fell from his eyes, and his sight was restored. Then he got up and was baptized, and after taking some food, he regained his strength.

For several days he was with the disciples in Damascus, and immediately he began to proclaim Jesus in the synagogues, saying, “He is the Son of God.”

People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, “I am going fishing.” They said to him, “We will go with you.” They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing.

Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, “Children, you have no fish, have you?” They answered him, “No.” He said to them, “Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some.” So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, “It is the Lord!” When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off.

When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, “Bring some of the fish that you have just caught.” So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, “Come and have breakfast.” Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, “Who are you?” because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead.

When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, “Simon son of John, do

you love me more than these?” He said to him, “Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Feed my lambs.” A second time he said to him, “Simon son of John, do you love me?” He said to him, “Yes, Lord; you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Tend my sheep.” He said to him the third time, “Simon son of John, do you love me?” Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, “Do you love me?” And he said to him, “Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.” Jesus said to him, “Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go.” He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God. After this he said to him, “Follow me.”

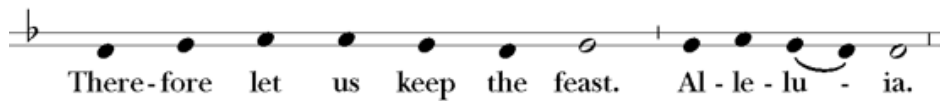
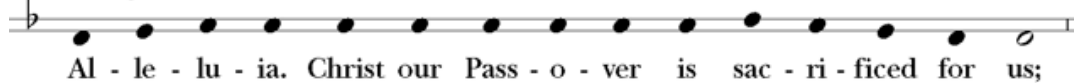

DISTRIBUTION

BCP p. 338

All baptized Christians who are regular communicants in their own churches are welcome to receive the Eucharist. You may receive kneeling or standing. The Sacrament is celebrated using wheat bread and fermented wine; if you cannot receive either for any reason, the Church has taught that receiving the Sacrament in one kind is to receive fully. If you prefer not to receive, you are welcome to come forward to receive a blessing from the priest or remain in your seat.

The ministers receive the Sacrament in both kinds, and then immediately deliver it to the people.

The Bread and the Cup are given to the communicants with these words

The Body (Blood) of our Lord Jesus Christ keep you in everlasting life. **Amen.**

For those participating via Live Streaming, since you are not able to receive Holy Communion, make an act of spiritual communion during the Communion of those present.

My Jesus, I believe that you are truly present in the Blessed Sacrament of the Altar. I love you above all things, and long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. As though you have already come, I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you; never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

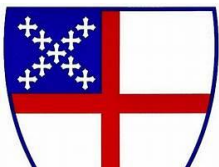

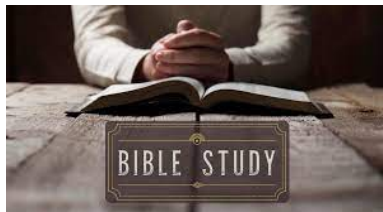

CODE BLUE CARE BAGS THANKS

Much gratitude is given to all parishioners who donated toiletries that were placed in Care Bags for distribution to individuals during the NJ code Blue season-November 1, 2024, through April 1, 2025. Our new program was also supported by the \$1000 Ellis Foundation Grant and Pastor Darlene of Beacon of Hope supplementing supplies as needed this winter. Members of the Venue donated toiletries & the Linus Project donated handmade baby blankets, gloves, and hats with scarves to our mission. Many St. Andrew's parishioners took turns packing the drawstring bags ready for distribution bi-weekly as well. Many hands make light work! As Burlington County housed the guests in area motels (Red Roof Inn, Red Carpet Inn & The Travel Lodge), Chairs of this Outreach Committee, Terri & Gary Ireland/Terri & John Sackett, delivered 1,660 bags to individuals staying in the motel rooms. Each Care Bags contained: A comb, travel sized shampoo bottle, body wash, 1 large wipe, a shaving kit, 1 toothpaste/toothbrush combo, disposable underwear, and 3 meals that were non-refrigerated, microwaveable.

- The First Presbyterian Church-Mt. Holly was given 60 pre-filled Care Bags for distribution at their weekly lunch program-Mondays/Fridays lunch.
- Providence House Shelter Program in Westampton & The Pinelands Family Success Center in Browns Mills were given the Linus Bag blanket donations & extra drawstring bags for new families.
- Oaks Integrated Care Food Pantry in Westampton was given packages of disposable underwear who help adults and families of mentally & physically challenged individuals.
- Dando Una Mano Non-Profit was given the toiletries for the migrant farm workers to help them stay healthy and well as the Garden States blooms throughout the spring and summer.

An estimated sum of \$26,560 was donated during this outreach program helping our neighbors that are less fortunate in our communities. Thank you for showing love to those who need it most like Christ has taught us to continue to do.

Daffodils bloomed all over Mount Holly thanks to the Design Committee of Main Street Mount Holly and Burlington County grant that were planted in the fall and are now in full focus this Spring.
