MINUTES OF THE 2019 ANNUAL MEETING

Financial Report: Father Andrew asked parishioners to review the Treasurer's report and 2020 Budget located on page 8-9 of the Annual Meeting booklet. Father Andrew discussed how our 2020 pledge campaign support does not meet the salaries of our employees: Father Andrew, Kris Carroll and Ed Robertson. He assured the congregation that the sky is not falling but reminded them we cannot continue to live off the interest of funds left to the church. Father Andrew explained that if parishioners would like to change your 2020 pledge contribution to please see Kris Carroll.

MOTION:Cliff Sporn made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report with gratitude, seconded by John Smythe. Motion carried.

ANNUAL REPORTS

Copies of the 2020 Annual Reports were distributed in booklet form at sign-in. Chip Miller spoke about the repairs to the Bell Tower and that the cost was 1,480.000, which of half was covered by insurance and half will be paid by the church. Chip explained that insurance covered the top part and the church paid for louvres.

Father Andrew asked each committee chair if they had anything to add to their reports. Craig Vaughn, Acolyte Master was not in attendance but Father Andrew did mention the need for more Acolytes and that if anyone is interested in serving as an Acolyte, please see him. Father also reminded everyone that the music report for 2019 was the purple insert.

Dwight Phillips mentioned that the Men's Group would like to see more men show up at their monthly meetings, which are held the 3rd Saturday of the month at 8am. Dwight also mentioned that there would be a Men's Breakfast on Saturday, February 15th.

Father Andrew mentioned that he attended a Youth Group meeting. He reported that the group has 6-8 youth participating in different activities.

John Powell mentioned that due to the temperature changes the painting to the Bell Tower would continue. The scaffolding will start coming down February 5th with hopes to be done for the Celebration of a New Ministry service. Father Andrew reminded everyone that next Sunday is Souper Bowl Sunday and to bring in a can of soup. Pat McCullough spoke about the ECW upcoming meeting on Tuesday, February 4th, she mentioned that everyone (men and women) were welcome to come and hear Darlene Trappier from Beacon of Hope speak. Pat McCullough also spoke about the upcoming ECW Soup Tasting and that tickets were still available and the cost was \$10.

Kris Carroll also mentioned the Shop with Scrip program which is one of the Men's Group fundraisers.

Father Andrew mentioned that on Saturday, February 15 at 10am Bishop William Stokes will be officiating the Celebration of New Ministry service and the Blessing of the restored Bell Tower. He also reminded everyone that the china and silverware would be brought out for the luncheon. The plan is to have the tables set-up for the luncheon on February 13th at 1pm, food will be delivered on Saturday and if you are able to help with clean-up it would be greatly appreciated as the Parish Hall needs to be set-up for the Community Dinner that evening at 6pm.

2020 FINANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

The Finance Committee meets on a regular basis during the year to review the Church's financial statements and to discuss future funding requirements and Church administration issues.

We meet with our account representative from Glenmede on a quarterly basis to review the performance of our account. At the end of the year, our investment balance at Glenmede for all funds was \$2,698,395.

The 2020 budget for Church operations anticipated that we would have to take money from our investment principal in addition to the standard income distributions.

1. Bell Tower Repairs: Repairs to the bell tower were completed and final payment was made. The total cost of repairs was \$1,430,701. Our insurance company paid \$983,131. St Andrews paid \$447,570 for repairs and upgrades to the bell tower.

St. Andrew's Church Music Ministry

Annual Report

The music ministry at St Andrews continues to serve the church community and Mount Holly as a vibrant group of musicians witnessing and serving the glory of God. The centerpiece of the ministry continues to be the senior choir.

The Senior Choir: With a core membership of 16 singers, this group sings at weekly Sunday services and special services from September through June. The choir rehearses for 90 minutes each week in the choir room. The choir leads in the singing of hymns and performs a choir anthem each week. In addition, the choir performs at special community and ecumenical services throughout the year, such as the Ash Wednesday and Maundy Thursday joint services with St Paul's Lutheran Church in Hainesport, NJ.

Highlights of 2020

*The COVID 19 pandemic suddenly halted choral activities as of the first week of March 2020. Diocesan guidelines have restricted singing inside the church and parish buildings. Choir rehearsals and participation in regular and special Eucharist celebrations have been put on hold until the Diocese, Vestry and Rector deem it safe to resume. All services, except for a brief period when the pandemic receded, are held with only celebrants, lector and music director present in the church. These services have been broadcast live on the internet through Facebook and Zoom.

- Music at our weekly Facebook and Zoom Eucharists and holy day services has been limited to instrumental music. Each service includes a piano prelude and postlude, and three hymns on the organ or piano. The lyrics to the hymns are included in the weekly service bulletin, with permission from “One License,” a subscription service which grants copyright permission.
- The Rancocas Valley Singers, a community choir of professional level, rehearsed in the parish house weekly until the shut down in March 2020.
- Choir members and parish musicians contributed to the celebration of the birth of our Lord on Christmas Eve and Christmas day and the Resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday through creating video and audio recordings of their performances. These were used as part of the Facebook live and Zoom broadcasts of our services.

Facilities

- The organ remains in fair condition, serviced twice a year by Charles Gibson, a pipe organ specialist. The key tops on the organ have yellowed with age, also cracked and some have fallen off. In addition, the presets located on the lower keyboard no longer function. Mr. Gibson has presented St Andrews with an estimate for the parts and labor of refurbishing the ivory keyboards and restoring function to the presets and harp stop. Some electrical interference is now causing some audio issues with the organ.

Hopefully, this can be addressed along with the refurbishing of the keyboards.

- The 1920 Steinway “O” baby grand piano resides in the nave. It is in top condition, maintained by Kurt Weisman and Grand Purpose Piano services. The piano has a built in (electrically powered) climate control unit. This regulates humidity and keeps the sound board and interior of the piano at a stable level. The piano has been used quite frequently throughout 2020 for hymns and to accompany choir anthems during the Mass.
- The piano in the parish house has been well maintained, tuned every six months. This is used for events in the parish house.
- The choir music library has been expanded, with several new anthems added this year. We look forward to having the choir re-assemble soon.

ALTAR FLOWERS REPORT 2020

Coordinators: Pat Jackson and Linda Robinson

2020 has proven to be an interesting year and will be one not soon forgotten. When the Covid-19 pandemic struck it put a halt to all indoor services at St. Andrew's. As a result, St. Andrew's became virtual. Morning Prayer, Evening Prayer, and Sunday Services were held on Facebook and Zoom. This also affected our altar flowers. From before Easter and until the beginning of indoor services on Sept. 6th there were no flowers on our altar.

Our Altar Flowers are memorials which are given by individual families who provide the names of loved ones they are donating the flowers to. The memorials may be either 2 vases or 4 vases for which they pay \$55 or \$100 respectively. Some Sundays are shared by 2 individual families choosing 2 vases each and paying \$55 each.

Poinsettias and Easter Lilies are memorials and "In honor of: (Memorials are for deceased – "In honor of" - are living individuals). They are purchased based on the amount of donations received. There is no set price to have a "memorial" or "In honor of" for these two occasions.

Our flowers are provided by Flower Junction. They work with us if there is a request for specific flowers or colors for our Altar Flowers. The poinsettias and the lilies for our floor set-up and the small altar poinsettias and palms are purchased through other vendors.

The Altar Flower Fund account is held at TD Bank ACCOUNT: 7869245121. Deposits are made and disbursements are paid according to what was provided. There is also a flower memorial fund that supplements memorial flowers Sundays and poinsettias and lilies, when needed.

Virtual Sunday School Report

In April, when we realized that the Covid Virus would be keeping us from worshipping in person, Vanessa Meredith and I began a Virtual Sunday School, at the suggestion of Aimee and Father Andrew. Parents were invited to register their children on the St. Andrew's web site.

Each Sunday morning our children log into Zoom for a half hour of songs, discussions and videos about the Gospel of the day. Each Child receives a craft packet to put together to help them learn about the lesson of the week.

Four to nine year-olds tune in at 10:30 each Sunday. Ten to thirteen-year olds tune in at 11:00.

Craft packets are delivered to each child's home each week. Presently, I deliver 19 packets each week. Not every child tunes in every week.

After our summer break in August, Vanessa was no longer able to help with Sunday school because of other obligations. Aileen Wells and Sabrina Radix stepped up to help.

In addition to our weekly Zoom meetings the Sunday school has sponsored two outreach programs. In October, we held a drive-thru Halloween event that welcomed all children from the area. We handed out over 300 bags of candy and small toys. In December we held a drive-thru St. Nicholas Day. The ladies of the ECW helped decorate bags that could be turned into puppets and these bags were filled with goodies plus a craft for each child. I think we handed out about 75 bags. The remaining bags were distributed between an Assisted Living Facility and the Monday morning food recipients.

In December, the children learned that Advent was a time of preparation and made their own preparations for our Christmas Pageant. Each family filmed their child or children and then our wonderful Aimee put it all together to make a magnificent show!

In the New Year we will continue our Virtual Sunday School until we are able to meet in person. If you know a child who would like to join us, please ask their parents to register them at the St. Andrew's web site.
